Descendant of Pvt. Charles Segur

*Ellen was at our encampment on Memorial weekend in Litchfield, Ct. The following is information she exchanges with me about her Descendants.*

*Charles Segur was in Company B. and was killed June 1, 1864 at Cold Harbor, VA. See Picture below. Residence: Kent, CT. Muster in: Sept. 11, 1862*

*My cousin and I realized on Saturday that another relative was killed on June 1 at Cold Harbor—Cpl. Myron Sterry. He was also my 3<sup>rd</sup> great uncle. Myron Sterry's niece married Charles Seger's nephew. Wow. Looking forward to hearing from you about both. – Ellen.*

*Enlistment: Aug. 8, 1862 Muster in: Sep. 11, 1862*

*Muster as a private and promoted Feb. 13, 1864 Killed June 1, 1864*

*Victor, thanks for mentioning the 2 other 3<sup>rd</sup> great uncle Sterrys! They both married and had several children. I have a little more from the Kent Register of Families, 1739-1999 about Henry: While serving in camp at Annapolis, Maryland, he fell through the roof of a guardhouse under construction and was injured, and in July 1862 he was discharged. Nevertheless, the next month he enlisted again on Aug. 19<sup>th</sup> in Co. B, 2<sup>nd</sup> Regt., CVHA. On Apr. 3, 1863 he was discharged again at Fort Worth, Virginia for disability.*

*Henry Sterry, Enlistment Aug. 19, 1862 Muster in: Sept. 11, 1862 Discharged due to disability July 7, 1865*

*George L. Sterry, Enlistment: Aug. 7, 1862 Muster in: Sept. 11, 1862 Muster in as Pvt. and detailed as a musician. Discharged July 7, 1865.*

*I've attached the 2 photos of Charles. (FYI, "Segur" is not a spelling that was ever used in our family history with anyone else. Seager in the 1600s, and some Segar throughout the 1800s, but Charles was the only "Segur"). Charles was my 3<sup>rd</sup> great uncle.*
